- 1. Where did you grow up? I grew up in a tiny town called Knappa, Oregon (silent K), which is about 10 miles east of Astoria at the very northwestern tip of Oregon.
- 2. Where did you go to school / learn to survey? I went to college at the Oregon Institute of Technology and transferred into the Geomatics program after two years in the Software Engineering program. While in college I did internships with the BLM out of Medford, OR and with a private survey firm in Seaside, OR.
- **3. What brought you to Sacramento?** I graduated from OIT, and moved to Sacramento with my brand-new bride to begin working for Psomas in Roseville in June 2008.
- 4. Where do you work? (Company/Job Title/Responsibilities) Psomas-Roseville/Senior Project Manager/Manage large scale mapping and R/W projects, ALTAs, and boundary surveys, manage field crews, as well as serve as Cad Support.
- 5. What is the most interesting Survey project you have been involved with? A few years back, I was the Production Manager on a project with DWR to create a geodatabase of the parcels they had rights over through the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. This involved drafting and cataloging the rights of approximately 10,000 parcels in a geodatabase system to allow DWR determine their rights more efficiently. # UNIVERSITY OF MAINE ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS UNTIL JULY 1

The University of Maine will continue to accept applications for the fall semester until July 1. Their current online options and how to apply can be viewed HERE (click on the picture that pertains to the degree) and are:

- (1) Undergraduate certificate in surveying engineering technology
- (2) BS in surveying engineering technology (ABET ETAC accredited)
- (3) Graduate certificate in surveying engineering
- (4) Professional Science Masters in Engineering and Business surveying engineering option

The undergrad certificate is an easy application and is a good way to work into the BS degree. They currently have 280 surveying students spread across the four options.

Out-of-state students enrolled in a UMaineOnline degree or certificate program receive a low tuition e-rate which is in-state\*1.25.


