#### **RECOGNITION OF SURVEYORS PASSED SINCE LAST MEETING**

A moment of silence was held for Thomas Earl Propst, LS 6098, Todd Dial, LS 7341, Stephen G. Nesvold, Pre 1982 RCE 25681, Larry Robert Bryant and Dale Roper, LS 5504.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The Legislative Committee report has been moved to take place after the approval of the minutes.

The agenda was approved as amended.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

The November 5, 2022 meeting minutes were approved as presented.

#### LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Mike Belote introduced his colleague, Anthony Molina who will be assisting him with CLSA lobbying activities. About 700-800 bills have already been introduced but they are expective around 2500 by the time the deadline passes on February 17<sup>th</sup>. They are planning a CLSA sponsored bill this year. Mike and Anthony will secure an author for that bill. There has been a high degree of turnover in the Assembly and Senate. Nearly 2/3 of the legislature will be very or totally new by January 1, 2025.

Mike Belote provided an overview of the recent developments in the *Crownholm v. BPELSG* case. In a recent decision, the judge ruled that it was not a free speech or equal protection violation, and the complaint has been dismissed without leave to amend.

Ian Wilson provided a report on committee activities. The committee is working on one CLSA sponsored bill and indicated that the language in the bill can be altered/amended before it reaches the Governor's desk for signature.

Regarding Digital Submissions, Robert Hanley is researching the issue and has been in touch with the association that deals with PDFs.

Caleb Mccallister is working on the lot line adjustments issue. One of the problems with the lot line adjustment suggestion is that it doesn't do the job by itself and creates other issues such as the need for a deed of conveyance. You could require the local jurisdiction to cause to be recorded a certificate of compliance. The other problem is that currently, there is no requirement for a beneficiary to have any say on the lot line adjustment and could create land that doesn't belong to anyone. A few lines are being added and a few other lines have been deleted from the suggested language. There was discussion on this issue.

## MOVED and SECONDED to approve language in Government Code 66412 as distributed in the Legislative Committee report. MOTION CARRIED.

There are amendments in the PRC that are scheduled to take place in mid-2025. Language was included in the committee report.

### MOVED and SECONDED to approve the language to the PRC 8850-8860 as distributed in the Legislative Committee report. MOTION CARRIED.

There was discussion on potential changes to section 8871 of the PLS Act (mandatory monumenting boundaries). It was noted that the language can be amended until the bill amendment deadline in September. Ian indicated that at the next board meeting, the board will be provided a list of bills for review.

### MOVED and SECONDED to approve the language to 8771 of the PLS Act as submitted in the Legislative Committee report. MOTION CARRIED.

MOVED to not accept the language as written. Noted that there is already a motion in place that needs to be voted on before proceeding with a new motion.

MOVED to make a friendly amendment to the motion. It was noted that friendly amendments are not accepted.

There was discussion on underground utility designation. The committee wants to explore language to amend underground utility designation to 8726(a) to add the word "detection"; Adding underground utility designation to 8726 (c and/or e) – add the word "site plan" i.e. property line or boundary of any parcel of land, right of way, easement, site plan; Adding the word "detection, site plans, accuracy statements" to 8761 (a, b, c, d) after the word "description.

# MOVED and SECONDED to authorize the Legislative Committee to explore the underground utility language and come back to the board with a recommendation. MOTION CARRIED.

#### Lunch break from 12:07pm – 1:00pm.

The committee also reported on discussed changes to 8765 (Record of Survey – exemptions).

#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

President Warren Smith recognized 2022 committee chairs and liaisons with certificates of appreciation. He mentioned National Surveyors Week and asked those in attendance to work with local surveyors to promote the event.
